Featuring Dr. Saundra L. Penn, LPC, RPT

Saundra Penn, Ph.D., LPC, RPT is an Assistant Professor in Human and Community Services at Queens University of Charlotte in Charlotte, NC. Additionally, Dr. Penn is a clinician practicing in Gastonia, N.C. where she counsels children and their families. Her research interests include multicultural issues in play therapy, the evolution of color blind racial attitudes, play therapy supervision, parent consultation, and mental health reform. She is a past board member for the North Carolina Association for Play Therapy and the Multicultural Play Therapy Center at the University of North Carolina Charlotte. She presents in a variety of forums to increase clinicians and lay persons' awareness of the therapeutic powers of play therapy.



Overview: This workshop is designed to explore the theoretical underpinnings of family play therapy as a prescriptive approach to working with child clients and their families. Different from family play therapy, individual play therapy can naturally cause systemic shifts in the family. Family play therapy, however, can also offer a culturally sensitive approach to integrating caregivers and siblings as well as contribute to a playful atmosphere for familial understanding and growth. Participants will have an opportunity to conceptualize and practice family play therapy activities for specific use with child clients and their families first hand.

Objectives: The participants will be able to 1) explain the rationale for the intersection of play and family therapy theories; 2) explore clinical scenarios where family play therapy is a culturally and developmentally appropriate treatment option; and 3) describe three play therapy activities for use in the assessment and/or treatment process with child clients and their families.

Play Therapy Activity: Cultural Ancestry Honoring

This purpose of this group activity is to honor the cultural ancestry of the participants using play therapy strategies. Participants place their symbol in a sandtray and choose a word or phrase that represents the gift of the toy and/or symbol (culture). When all of the symbols are placed, everyone speaks their word/phrase again, with a short moment of silence to honor our ancestors and all of what our cultures and ancestors bring to us in learning...the good, the less than good, and the mystery too.

Objectives: The participants will 1) exhibit an awareness of both the uniqueness and the common landscapes that culture brings to human brings using play therapy strategies and 2) express an embodied experience of our differentiated selves within a group, accompanied by linking ourselves in community of play therapists.

Integrating Experiential and Playful Practices into the Supervision of Play Therapists: Techniques to Address Issues around Diversity

Presenter: Deborah Armstrong Hickey, Ph.D., LMFT has been practicing as a Marriage and Family Therapist specializing in Play and Expressive Therapies for over thirty years. She has served as President of the South Carolina and the California APT branches and serves on the SCAPT Board of Directors as Immediate Past President and Nomination and Election Chairperson. She teaches in the Capella University Marriage and Family Therapy program and practices out of The Mindgarden, in Greenville, South Carolina. She has been supervising play therapists for over twenty years, using principally experiential practices.

Overview: This breakout session is directed towards supervisors of play therapists who are interested in integrating experiential and playful practices into their supervisory work that address issues around working with clients of diverse backgrounds. Participants will be briefly introduced to didactic material, followed by three experiential exercises that will allow them to dive deeply into using these practices in their work with supervisees. If time allows, a role-play session will also be conducted.

Objectives: The participants will 1) examine a developmental model of understanding supervision of play therapists; 2) explore supervisory practices as they pertain specifically with supervision of play therapists; 3) discuss the value of integrating awareness of diversity into their supervision practices; and 4) identify three practices in the supervision of play therapists that are: experiential and playful; develop the self of the therapist; and concern themselves with deeply attuning to and resonating with clients from backgrounds that may be viewed as being diverse.
