- 3. Identify at least three dynamics of sexual abuse which may be utilized to underscore play therapy assessment and intervention of sexually abused individuals
- 4. Describe areas of clinical need for children and adolescents who have been victims of childhood sexual abuse and discuss ways in which play therapy can be utilized to meet these needs

- 5. Identify 2-3 cultural considerations when working with sexually abused children in the play therapy setting
- 6. Discuss 1-2 areas of special consideration when working with sexually traumatized children and adolescents in play therapy
